
















SNGMS Board Meeting minutes for April 26, 2022

Treasurers Report: Account Balances were reported.

<u>Birthstone for the Month of May is Emerald:</u> Is a precious gem stone and a variety of the mineral Beryl ($Be_3Al_2(SiO_3)_6$) colored green by trace amounts of chromium and sometimes vanadium. Beryl has a hard-

ness of 7.5–8 on the Mohs scale and is in the hexagonal crystal family. In mythology Emerald was associated with Mercury, the messenger of the gods and is the protection stone of travelers. The green gemstone symbolizes hope and development and was a stone of divine intuition for the Greeks. Emerald is regarded as a powerful stone for problems of impaired balance such as vertigo.




Finding the Shop Location
