The club wishes to express our condolences to Pauline Moore and her family on the passing of her husband Richard. Both are long-time members and Richard was a past board member. We also send our thoughts and prayers to Marty Lange and her family on the passing of her son Michael Crandall. We are truly sorry for your losses.

It has been brought to my attention that we have a very distinguished gentleman in our club. In May George Messenger was awarded an honorary doctorate degree in engineering from Worchester Polytechnic Institute in Worchester Massachusetts. George is an internationally recognized authority on the hardening of electronic systems. George earned a B.S. in physics from WPI in 1951, holds an M.S. in electrical engineering from the University of Pennsylvania and a Ph.D. in engineering from California Coast University. He developed the Messenger-Spratt Engineering Equation, which describes the effects of neutron radiation on bipolar devices and discovered the Kirk Effect-also called current-induced base push-out-an apparent increase in the width of the base of bipolar transistors that occurs at very high injection levels and current densities. George received the Annual Merit Award from the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Nuclear and Plasma Sciences Society, the Peter Haas Award for outstanding technical contributions to hardened military and space systems. He established the Dargon Fund in 1983 and has served as its general manager since then. For his pioneering contributions to the development of solid-state electronic and his impressive record of success as an entrepreneur and investor, WPI takes great pride in conferring upon alumnus George Messenger the Degree of Doctor of Engineering, Honoris Causa.




