<u>Birthstone for the Month of February is Amethyst:</u> Amethyst occurs in primary hues from a light pinkish violet to a deep purple and it may exhibit one or both secondary hues, red and blue. The best varieties of amethyst can be found in Siberia, Sri Lanka, Brazil and the far East. The ideal grade is called "Deep Siberian". Amethyst was used as a gemstone by the ancient Egyptians and was largely employed in antiquity for intaglio engraved gems. The Greeks believed amethyst gems could prevent intoxication, while medieval European soldiers wore amethyst amulets as protection in battle in the belief that amethysts heal people and keep them cool-headed.





SNGMS Board meeting minutes for 2/01/18

On February 1st, 2018, the regular Board of Directors meeting of the Southern Nevada Gem and Mineral Society was called to order at 6:06 PM by the President. The Secretary was present. The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

The minutes of the January 4th, 2018 meeting were approved as read.

The treasurer reported the account balances and that the income for January was positive.

Membership chair reported 267 adults and 22 children as of the last update.

Shop Report: The need for a shop supervisor meeting, shop equipment training, and institution of shop certification cards was noted. Wayne Muth proposed, seconded by Del Walkenshaw, and approved by the Board that, "wheels for Cab Kings be purchased, up to \$1,000.00."

Shop Talk: Rock Tumbling by Michael Kirk (Part 1 of 2)

Hello fellow Rock hounds! I am an avid Rock Tumbler! I often get asked: "Why don't my rocks have a shine on them when I am done? Well, there are 2 Reasons:

- 1. You rushed the steps.
- **2. Grit contamination** (meaning some grit from the previous steps was left in there from the previous steps. The first thing to remember when tumbling is to tumble the correct stones. Stones with pits and grooves will hold grits into the next stages and ruin that stage. The worst kind of stone to tumble is **DRUZY Quartz**. Don't do this! The best kind of stone is pretty close to round. Also take into consideration the "MOHS" scale of hardness. Obsidian and Agate do not mix. The best shines come from the hardest stones. Agate and Jasper are 2 of my favorites.

Tumbling Grit is available in a wide range of grades (sizes) and each grade is designated by a number 60/90/220/400/600/etc.







Shop Talk:

(Part 1 of Rock Tumbling Continued from Pg 3)

Polishing Agents are oxides of metal as reflected in their names: tin oxide, cerium oxide, aluminum oxide, etc. Some polish stones better than others, and if we were running a single type of gem material through our tumbles, we would be wise to select the oxide that works best for it. For my use, I use tin oxide. This works best on Agate and Jasper. Tin Oxide produces a bit higher polish.

A point to consider before selecting a tumbler is what are you going to do with the gemstone? A 12 lb. barrel will hold about 1,000 stones, if all you want is to make up a little jewelry, a 2-3 lb. barrel should do the trick.

THE FIRST GRIND Fill barrel 2/3 full with stones, add 60/90 grit as directed (depending on your barrel size). ADD 1 tbsp of 20 Mule Team Borax (available @ Walmart laundry soap section) this cushions the water and makes the stones glide over on another easier. I know it sounds crazy, but it works!! Next, add 3-4 TUMS to the barrel. (gas BUILDS UP IN THE TUMBLER And this keeps the gas down, NO joke!!, then add water up to the ¾ line, put the lid on, and give it a shake, and put the tumbler on the rollers. When the stones are tumbling correctly you will hear them stumbling over each other not sliding, the stones should be checked daily. The purpose of the first grind is to remove all the rough surfaces, crevices, blemishes, etc. A normal run in coarse grit is 4-5 days, if not enough material was grinded off, the process stars again. When the stones are at the desired shape, it is time to do the next step.

*****WARNING*** DO NOT DUMP THE SLURRY AND ROCKS INTO THE SINK TO BE WASHED!!! YOUR PIPES WILL TURN TO CEMENT! Get a colander and bucket from Home Depot and wash them into the bucket.

GOOD LUCK! I will do my best to answer your questions.

I Found A Rock, What is it? (By Bruce Martin)

According to somebody I know there are 3 kinds of rocks. There are (UR) Ugly Rocks, aka leaverite, then there are those that are quite collectable (PR) Pretty Rocks and (BR) Beautiful Rocks. Most lapidary people focus on BRs.

When I pick up a rock I usually look at the color, pattern, texture or density. But how do you determine what that rock is?

There are well over 2,000 different minerals and add rocks to the mix, that's a lot to figure out.

Certain minerals are easy to identify such as Quartz, Agate, Jasper and more. Rock such as Granite, Obsidian and Sandstone are also easy. Most are not easy. There are many different tools to help you in this quest. Books are a tremendous help. I use several such as National Audubon Society's "Field Guide to Rocks and Minerals" and "DK Handbook to Rocks and Minerals" to name a few.

These books list many tests to aid you in the identification process. Some tests are easy, such as Hardness (what can scratch it), Color, Luster ad Streak. Others are more complicated and some should be used with caution, such as Flame, Acid and Specific Gravity. I would never suggest you taste as some minerals are toxic.

Another huge help is other club members. We have some very experienced folks and most love to talk about the subject of rocks.

In conclusion, the best way to determine what you have found is to read and ask questions.
